In March of 2015, the Lord opened the door for a return trip to Peru. This trip would be solo, without a ministry team from the USA but it was clearly in God's plan to go. There was almost a sense of urgency in my heart to be there.

I once again had the privilege of working with Pastor Isaac Chapa as the host and coordinator for all meetings conducted. There were re-encounters with old friends (pastors and churches) and introductions to new ones.

Each service included salvations accompanied by people filled with the Holy Spirit.

Jesus likened the Kingdom of God unto a mustard seed (Luke 13:18-19). The mustard seed is a very, very small seed. However, once planted and the plant fully grown, it provides a safe haven and resting place for

Taking it to the Streets of Costa Rica

Although I may be biased, there are few countries on the globe as beautiful as Costa Rica. With its lush green rain forests, majestic mountains and ocean front beaches, both Atlantic and Pacific, Costa Rica has it all.

However, get into the

cities or surrounding communities away from where the main tourist attractions are and you quickly find that many of Costa Rica's precious people are casualties of poverty, just as in all nations. It is a universal truth that people need the Lord. They need His love and mercy and they

need His power in their lives to break the power of sin: lack, poverty, sickness and brokenness. These are the very things that Jesus came to deliver humanity from. II Corinthians 8:9 says that Jesus became poor that we might be-

meeting in particular I would like to focus on, because it shows just how in control Jesus is when we are simply willing and obedient to do His work.

Working with pastor Herrera Vasquez included speaking at several cell groups. The final group wanted to do an outside meeting on a small playground used as a soccer field. Most attendees were from the cell group, so when the time for an altar call came, only a few people came forward for salvation and several more for healing. However, a group of men and teenagers who had previously departed when we arrived, returned to reclaim the soccer field as our meeting was ending.

And I thought the meeting was ending too, but when I sensed all of these men, some old, some younger, lining up opposite of where I was preaching, I quickly turned around, almost without realizing I was doing it, and preached the Gospel to them. I followed with an altar call. Not one person responded to the call or even spoke a word. Sensing the Lord wanted to do something, I walked across the field and made another appeal to accept Christ. Still nothing. Almost as if Jesus was pushing me to ask again, I invited them to pray one more

time—anyone that would come. A young man said, “why don’t you pray for all of us.” I said I would be honored to. As one came forth, another followed until all were in front of me. I led what appeared to be a couple dozen men in prayer. It was one of the most amazing, divine moves of God I had witnessed. Everyone of them accepted Christ as their savior. My heart was amazed as one man praying with me pointed out his son, who had also prayed and likely no more than 13 years old.

They thanked me for coming, and thanked God for what He had done. I know that night was a divine appointment of God for that cell group to meet on that playground and I know those men, young and old, are eternally changed because they are in God’s kingdom now.

In late October, into early November, 2015, Henok Alemayehu, an evangelist and my very dear friend, and I joined Reverend Manuel Garcia for two weeks of ministry in Costa Rica. As we often do, we ministered at pastors conferences, in Bible Schools and in various churches. The ministry was wonderful and many lives, including pastors and congregations, were touched by God's Word and His power.

During this ministry trip we also had the pleasure of once again, working with Apostle Jose' Gonzalez' church, Templo de Fe y Milagros (Temple of Faith and Miracles.) Apostle Jose' was actually ministering in Chicago at the time, sowing into the United States even as Brother Henok and I were there sowing into Costa Rica. Working with Apostle Jose's senior associate pastor, Jonathan Blanco, we were



given the opportunity to preach the Gospel on the streets of some of the tougher areas of San Jose, Costa Rica. Romans 1:16 declares that the Gospel is "... the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes..." I will never cease to be amazed at how people respond to the Gospel when it is preached. God's power is in His Gospel.

The move of God's power was incredible as we saw many young people give their lives to Jesus Christ as the ministry team preached on the

streets in San Jose. The next day, many of them confirmed their commitment by showing up in the Sunday morning's service at Templo de Fe y Milagros.

The natural beauty of Costa Rica was matched by the beauty of God's Word and His Spirit as we saw Him faithfully minister to the people of Costa Rica. What an honor and a privilege it is to represent Him with faithful ministry partners and take this Gospel into all the world.
